# 1 THE ALPES STATIONS


**The Provence-Alpes-Côte d'Azur (PACA)** region is famous the world over for its coastline and the Provençal hinterland. It sees its mountain ranges gaining new followers every winter-spring season

Stations have developed from and around villages that are still there. It was their inhabitants who built the first lifts, from the 1930s

In March 2018, Tomorrowland announced the coming of a new festival (EDM), Tomorrowland Winter, to take place in March in Alpes d'Huez in the French Alps. The first Tomorrowland Winter took place between 13 and 15 March 2019.

This mountain line is of course not exclusive to the PACA, but takes a large place in this region.

- More than 60 resorts with a large ski area
- A constellation of villages and Nordic ski centers
- 2,500 km of downhill ski slopes
- 1200 km of cross-country trails


The Orcières Merlette resort is perched at an altitude of 1,850 meters, up to 2,725 meters.

You can also indulge in many other activities in winter: snowmobiling, dog sledding, buoy on snow ...



The SuperDévoluy resort is a family resort. Many facilities and activities have been specially set up to accommodate young and old.

The snowpark has been named the Mushroom's park. At 2,000 m altitude, it is the meeting place for riders as well as freestylers



Serre Chevalier is a ski resort renowned for its vast ski area which reaches over 2,800m in altitude. It's the first unconnected French domain with its 250 km of alpine ski slopes. The resort is located near the Italian border, which makes it a perfect destination for combining mountain holidays and tourism.

## A special resort

Alpes d'Huez resort is located at 1,860 meters of altitude.

the Pic Blanc, culminating at 3,330 meters, offers a grandiose panorama, classified 3 stars in the Michelin Guide, on the Ecrins National Park and its prestigious peaks including Mont Blanc.

Following a call for tenders from local authorities, the Belgium organization sign for 5 years with this alpes village.

In March 2018, Tomorrowland announces the first winter edition of the festival, entitled Tomorrowland Winter at Alpe d'Huez.

30,000 people are expected for this first mountain edition.

This first edition brings together 26,000 people.

The highest stage is at an altitude of 3,300 meters

The story of Tomorrowland Winter will continue in 2022 and the "People of Tomorrow" will come together again for the adventure of a lifetime full of snow, music and secrets to be discovered in the magnificent landscapes of the French mountains.
