The most beautiful lakes in France

There are thousands of lakes, ponds and marshes in France. Lake Geneva, the largest lake in Western Europe with its 582 km2, one third of which is located on French territory and the other part in Switzerland, is indicated for its French part in Haute-Savoie.

The Grant deathful lakes in thance. The list of lakes in France below roughly distinguishes three categories: mountain lakes, classified by massif, plain lakes, classified by river basin, and coastal lakes.

- * Lakes in mountain ranges can be natural, often of origin glacial or volcanic, or man-made, usually for the purpose of hydroelectric production or regulation of flow.
- Lowland lakes can be natural or intended to serve reservoir (PR) or be created by a retaining dam.
- Coastal lakes, close to the sea can be filled freshwater or saltwater.
